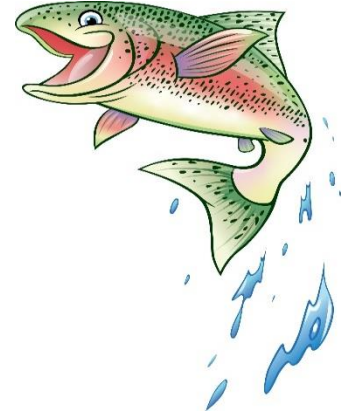


Overview: Day Four

Activity: Use materials around your house to build a cross. Think sticks, legos, blankets on the floor, etc. Use paper and scissors to create a paper heart for each member of the group. Write each name on a heart and put it on your cross you created.

Younger Track (Preschool-Grade 1)

- Questions-
 - Describe a time when you made a bad choice and there were consequences or a punishment because of that choice.
 - Describe a time when you had to forgive someone else for making a bad choice that affected you.
 - How can we show Jesus that we are thankful for His forgiveness?

Older Track (Grades 2-6)

- Questions-
 - Describe a time when you did something and received a punishment or consequence. Was it a fair consequence/punishment? Did it help you to not do that again?
 - Describe a time when you had to forgive someone else for doing something to you. Was it easy or hard for you to forgive them?
 - How can you show Jesus that you are thankful for the forgiveness He gives you?

Day 4: Texture Rubbings

Supplies included in your kit:

- Paper
- Jumbo crayon pieces

Supplies not included:

- Items with texture
- Tape

What to do:

1. Hunt through your house and outside to find several things that have an interesting texture. Here are some ideas:
 - Coins
 - Combs
 - Bottoms of tennis shoes
 - Ornate picture frames, decorative plates
 - Mosaics
 - Leaves, small flowers, clover
 - Bark
 - Lace, ribbon, doilies
 - Engraved items
2. Place a textured item on a flat surface, tape it down if you think it might slide around. Lay a piece of paper on top of your textured item. You can tape the paper down too if you think it might slide around – this is especially important for the youngest children.
3. Use the round side of the fat crayons to rub color onto the paper over your textured item. You should rub over it many times and apply a little pressure. The more you rub over it the more detail will show up in your picture.
4. Choose another object and add its texture to your paper. Use a different color or keep it the same. Keep choosing new objects until your paper is filled.
5. There is plenty of paper and you won't run out of crayons, so keep making collages, experimenting with different textures and colors to make more beautiful pictures.
6. In the video I demonstrated another texture picture by repeating the rubbing of the same leaf in 4 different quadrants of a paper, using a different color for each quadrant. Folding the paper in fourths creates “pockets” to hold the leaves in place – see video.



7. Your texture rubbing can be hung on the wall or used for notepaper for letters, or for wrapping small presents, or even as dinner placemats. Be creative!
