SCRIPTURE READINGS

L: The First Reading for the Festival of Pentecost is from Numbers, chapter eleven.

²⁴ So Moses went out and told the people what the Lord had said. He brought together seventy of their elders and had them stand around the tent. ²⁵ Then the Lord came down in the cloud and spoke with him, and he took some of the power of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied—but did not do so again.

²⁶ However, two men, whose names were Eldad and Medad, had remained in the camp. They were listed among the elders, but did not go out to the tent. Yet the Spirit also rested on them, and they prophesied in the camp. ²⁷ A young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp."

²⁸ Joshua son of Nun, who had been Moses' aide since youth, spoke up and said, "Moses, my lord, stop them!"

²⁹ But Moses replied, "Are you jealous for my sake? I wish that all the Lord's people were prophets and that the Lord would put his Spirit on them!" ³⁰ Then Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp.

¹ When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans?" ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. ²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

SUGGESTIONS TO REDUCE CAREGIVER STRESS

- ♥ **SEEK SUPPORT AND COUNSEL:** A caregiver may need counseling from a clergy member or a paid counselor to help understand that a caregiver should not expect to provide all of the care for an elderly loved one all of the time. It can be destructive for the caregiver and, in the end negative for the care receiver. Caregivers need to be at least occasionally refreshed in body and mind before they can provide the best ongoing care long-term. A caregiver support group, either in person or online (such as the [Caregiver Forum](http://www.CaregiverForum.com) on AgingCare.com), is a good start and something to continue using. If you're stuck, you may want to also seek some professional counseling to help yourself move forward. Redeemer Parish Nurses, Jan and Iva, are available for help with finding resources
- ♥ **MAKE PEACE WITH THE PAST, LIVE IN THE PRESENT:** Recently I read: "One can't serve coffee from an empty cup". Nothing can undo what is done. That's why ongoing guilt—even if you feel its earned—is useless. It's better to work positively with what is now reality than to wallow in the past about what might have been. If your spouse ate a diet of sweets while he was diabetic, it is not your fault. You likely made suggestions and helped in any way possible but we can't live other's lives for them. No matter what—nothing changes that reality.
- ♥ **ACCEPT WHAT IS:** When siblings won't help, no matter how much that has been tried to convince that that help is needed and wanted, then there is little choice but to become the decision maker. Hiring help may be the only option.


