

LUTHER'S DIVINE SERVICE IN WORSHIP THIS FALL!

With the big 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, the Music and Worship team along with the staff would like to encourage the use of Luther's setting – Setting five in our hymnal. In Luther's day, worship attendee's would come to worship and sit with little participation. The language was not their own - they did not hear the Word of God. Through the Reformation, Luther brought the Word of God to the people through translating the Bible into the vernacular and writing hymns to teach the people about God and what we believe. He kept much of the framework of the service, but included participatory time for the congregation—singing, and through that they were learning! As we learn together, be actively engaged in the text - what am I learning about God? This was new to the people then and we can appreciate the message we still receive today! You can further your knowledge by opening your hymnal to the hymn number to read the full text. We cannot possibly sing every stanza that is found in this setting, or we would have a much longer service. Luther's setting can be found on page 213 and the hymns we are using are: LSB 948 - All Glory Be to God Alone, LSB 960 - Isaiah, Mighty Seer in Days of Old (the Sanctus - words from Isaiah 6), LSB 823 - May God Bestow on Us His Grace (often called the first mission hymn to go out and share Christ's love with others).

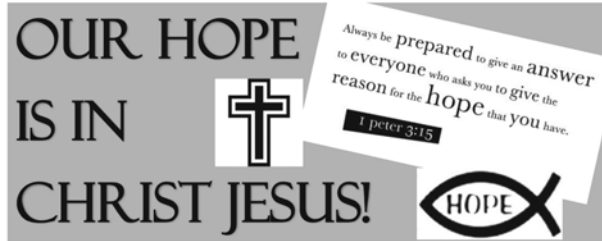


CHRISTMAS GREENERY

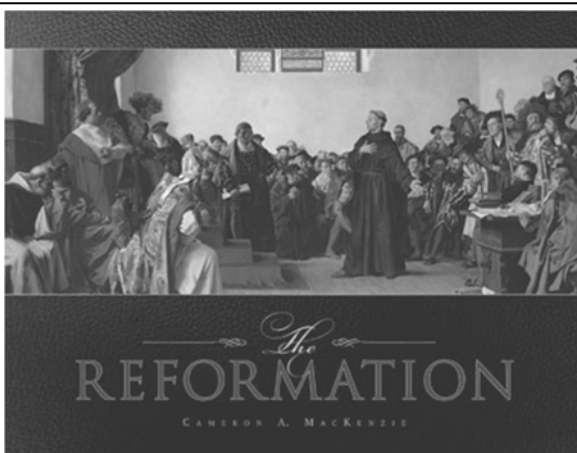

Health Notes

Take Control of Your Health: Get Tested for Breast Cancer

Getting regular mammograms is one of the most important things a woman can do to find breast cancer early – when it’s small, hasn’t spread, and is easier to treat.

The American Cancer Society recommends the following for finding breast cancer early in women at average risk and without symptoms:

- **Women ages 40 to 44** should have the choice to start annual breast cancer screening with mammograms if they wish to do so.
- **Women ages 45 to 54** should get mammograms every year.
- **Women 55 and older** should switch to mammograms every 2 years, or can continue yearly screening. Screening should continue as long as a woman is in good health and is expected to live 10 more years or longer.
- **All women** should be familiar with the known benefits, limitations, and potential harms linked to breast cancer screening.
- **Some women at high risk for breast cancer** – because of their family history, a genetic tendency, or certain other factors – should be screened with MRIs along with mammograms. (The number of women who fall into this category is very small.)

Talk with a health care professional about your risk for breast cancer and the best screening plan for you.
