

¹¹ While the man held on to Peter and John, all the people were astonished and came running to them in the place called Solomon's Colonnade. ¹² When Peter saw this, he said to them: "Fellow Israelites, why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk? ¹³ The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus. You handed him over to be killed, and you disowned him before Pilate, though he had decided to let him go. ¹⁴ You disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. ¹⁵ You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. ¹⁶ By faith in the name of Jesus, this

Health Notes

World Autism Awareness Month

Autism, or spectrum disorder, refers to a range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication, as well a by unique strengths and differences. We know that there are many types, caused by different combinations of genetic and environmental influences.

The term "spectrum" reflects the wide variation in challenges and strengths possessed by each person with autism.

Autism's most-obvious signs tend to appear between 2 and 3 years of age. In some cases, it can be diagnosed as early as 18 months.

Some facts about autism:

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates autism's prevalence as 1 in 68 children in the US. More boys and girls are affected.
- An estimated 50,000 teens with autism become adults – and lose school based autism services– each year.
- Around one third of people with autism remain nonverbal.
- Two thirds of the people with autism have normal or above normal IQ's.

The information here is not meant to diagnose or treat and should not take the place of personal consultation, with a qualified health care professional It is only meant to have an awareness of the challenges families face when a child has autism.
