

# Health Notes

## The Loop, Hearing Aids and Hearing Loss

Since the Loop has been installed, there has been a lot of conversation about individuals being hard of hearing. Common areas of concern are how it affects communication between spouses, in families and in relationships. It has been determined that a Doctor of Audiology will be present on Sunday, August 26, following the 9:30 am service to discuss the Loop, hearing aids and other aspects of hearing loss. Meanwhile the staff will be happy to talk to you about The Loop and telecoil.

Don't take your ears for granted. Hearing loss is the third most common health problem in the U.S., and it can affect the quality of your life and relationships. Being hard of hearing can impact your life more than obesity, diabetes, or strokes. It causes social isolation and depression.

Advanced age is the most common reason for hearing loss, but not all people are affected. 45% of people in their 60s have hearing loss. 68% of people in their 70s have hearing loss. But don't forget!! Young people have hearing loss because of loud music and genetic causes.

Symptoms of hearing loss are not hearing someone who is talking behind you, people are mumbling when they are speaking, trouble hearing people on the phone or listening to TV and radio at a loud volume or not hearing the alarm clock. It is important to get a diagnosis early and learn as much as you can about hearing loss and what hearing aids can do for you.

Because of stigma of hearing loss, the average older adult waits 7 to 10 years to get a hearing device. Only 20 to 30% then get a hearing device. The longer a person waits with uncorrected hearing loss, the greater the risk to the brain of losing the ability to translate the sound of someone talking into comprehensible speech. Have you ever heard that hearing aids don't work for individuals???? It's not always the hearing aid!! There is great information available from AARP. [AARP.org/hearing](http://AARP.org/hearing)
