Health Notes

HOW DO FOOD ALLERGIES AFFECT REDEEMER?

Because there is an increase in the number of people experiencing allergies, the Redeemer Health Cabinet is looking to form a food policy concerning food allergies—especially in children. Should we make Redeemer a Nut Free Facility?

Food allergy is a serious and potentially life-threatening medical condition affecting up to 15 million Americans. One in every 13 children has a food allergy—that’s about 2 in every U.S. classroom. And every 3 minutes, a food allergy reaction sends someone to the emergency room.

Food allergy is among the diseases considered to be part of the Atopic March. Also known as Allergies March, this term refers to the progression of allergic diseases in a person’s life: eczema, food allergy, allergic rhinitis and asthma. Not everyone will follow this progression, or experience every condition.

The job of the body’s immune system is to identify and destroy germs (such as bacteria or viruses) that make you sick. A food allergy happens when your immune system overreacts to a harmless food protein—an allergen. In the U.S., the eight most common food allergens are milk, egg, peanut, tree nuts, soy, wheat, fish and shellfish.

All food allergies have one thing in common: They are potentially serious. Always take food allergies—and people who live with them seriously. Food allergy reactions can vary unpredictable from mild to severe. Mild food allergy reactions may involve only a few hives or minor abdominal pain. Some food allergy reactions progress to severe anaphylaxis with low blood pressure and loss of consciousness.
