Health Notes

THE USES FOR OPIOIDS

Opioid prescription drug abuse is a significant issue in healthcare today. Between 2000 and 2015 more than half a million people died in the US from opioid-related drug overdoses (Rudd, 2016). In Minnesota, there were 395 opioid overdose deaths in 2016, 194 that involved prescription opioids, and 150 overdose deaths that involved heroin. (MDH, 2017).

Opioids, also known as opiates, are narcotic painkillers that act on opioid receptors in the body. Doctors prescribe opioids for both acute and chronic pain management. However, legally regulated opioids, such as oxycodone and illegal opiates including heroin are often used recreationally and frequently result in opiate addiction.

Doctors may prescribe opioids for a range of pain – related conditions, such as pain relief during recovery from surgery. Patients with long-term illnesses as arthritis, chronic back pain or cancer-related pain often find relief through opioids.

Alternatively, opioids may be prescribed for patients who have a high tolerance for less effective pain medications and cannot find relief through non-narcotic means. Recreational drug users may take either Schedule I opioids, such as heroin, and Schedule II medications, such as fentanyl, oxycodone and Demerol, to achieve a “high”.

The Boards of Medical Practice, Nursing and Pharmacy are working on means to decrease the use of opioids for pain. My purpose in writing this article is to create an awareness that the doctor may not always be correct in prescribing opioids. You are responsible for knowing what medications you are taking and why you are taking them.
