¹⁸ Because the Lord revealed their plot to me, I knew it, for at that time he showed me what they were doing. ¹⁹ I had been like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter; I did not realize that they had plotted against me, saying, "Let us destroy the tree and its fruit; let us cut him off from the land of the living, that his name be remembered no more."

Health Notes

Considerations Before Making Your Decision to Receive a flu shot:

- Cookies will be available at the flu shot clinic!!!
- Influenza is a serious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes even death. An annual flu vaccine is the best way to reduce the chances that you will get seasonal flu and lessen the chance that you will spread it to others.
- Hy-Vee is offering a quadrivalent injectable vaccine (ages 6 and over), the FluMist intranasal vaccine (ages 6-49) and a high-dose trivalent injectable vaccine recommended for those over the age of 65.
- Hy-Vee is administering a vaccine that covers 4 flu strains. (two Influenza-A and two influenza-B.)
- It is even more important for you to get the flu vaccination while pregnant. The antibodies that your body develops from the vaccine will be shared with the baby and help provide your infant some protection against the flu when the child is born.
- Please bring your insurance card; it will help the staff bill your claim quickly and accurately. This includes your Medicare card.
- The cost without insurance is \$39.95.
- It takes about 2 weeks for protection to develop after vaccination, and protection lasts through the flu season. The CDC recommends getting the vaccine as soon as it is available to give your body the chance to build up immunity before the flu season is in full force.
- The flu vaccine consists of inactivated flu particles. There is no live flu virus in the flu shots. The vaccine cannot cause the flu.
- If you have a cold but are otherwise feeling normal, then you can still get the vaccine.
