What You Should Know About Advance Care Planning

Did you know that it is recommended that **everyone age 18 and older prepare a Health Care Directive**?

Jan Dicke and Stephanie Fisk recently attended a seminar on Advance Care Planning, and were able to bring back many pieces of important information for the members of Redeemer's congregation!

Advance Care Planning involves preparation **NOW** when you have the capacity to make your own medical decisions. You do not need to have a chronic illness or be in poor health to think about a time in the future when you may not be able to make choices about your medical care. A Health Care Directive is a legal document, but you don't need a lawyer to create one!

Everyone should make sure they **communicate** their wishes and values with their loved ones and health care team. Starting the conversation may seem difficult, but it ensures that your health care choices are honored if an injury or illness leaves you unable to speak for yourself. Look for opportunities to discuss Advance Care Planning with your family and close friends!
