¹ But now, this is what the Lord says—he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. ² When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. ¹ What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? ² By no means! We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? ³ Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

⁵ For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶ For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin — ⁷ because anyone who has died has been set free from sin.



ASYLUM FOR MARTHA

Martha, who is our Arab Women's Ministries leader, has made the difficult decision to apply for asylum in the U.S.; because of the political situation in Egypt which has remained bad or even worsened for Christians, making it extremely dangerous for her to return there even for a short visit. The legal fees involved with the asylum application are \$4000 and are about \$2000 more than Martha can pay at this time.

Martha is a blessing to many as she shares the Gospel with those who have not heard it. She has a birthday on January 8, so it seems like a happy time to offer the opportunity to any in our Family of Believers who feel led, to help her with her legal fees.

GIVING OPPORTUNITY: The Warming House

Throughout the month of January, we will be **COLLECTING WARM CLOTHING** for the Warming House here in Rochester. It is a shelter for people who are homeless to go to when the temperature reaches below a certain point. They receive a warm bed, a warm meal, and when needed, they can receive warm clothing, such as sweatshirts, jackets, gloves, etc... Prayerfully consider helping us reach out to our community to make sure that all people are safe and warm.

- ♥ **Used items** they will accept: hats, gloves, coats, scarves, sweatpants, sweatshirts.
- ♥ Items they will accept **only new**: socks and underwear.

Health Notes

COPD

Chronic lower respiratory disease, mainly COPD, is the fourth leading cause of death in the US. "Breathing is Everything!" While tobacco smoke is the primary cause, 1 in 4 people with COPD have never smoked. Air pollutants at home (secondhand smoke), at work (fumes), and genetics can cause COPD.

COPD refers to a group of diseases that cause airflow blockage and breathing-related problems that causes shortness of breath, chronic phlegm productions and wheezing. Early diagnosis and treatment may shorten its course. Treatment requires a careful and thorough doctor's evaluation, avoiding tobacco smoke and removing air pollutants from the home and at work. Symptoms can be treated with medications including inhalers. A doctor may also consider pulmonary rehabilitation, a personalized treatment program that teaches you how to manage COPD symptoms to improve quality of life. More than 140,000 Americans die of COPD a Year--that is a death every 4 minutes.
