That thou my king would die for me?”

(*) BLESSING OF PALMS (*The congregation raises their palm branches on the responses.*)

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: **And also with you.**

P: Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord.

C: **Hosanna in the highest!**

P: Let us pray.

Jesus, blessed are You, the one who comes in the name of the Lord. As the crowds on Palm Sunday shouted their hosannas to You, give us the strength and courage to shout our hosanna's to You each day of our lives; regardless of where we are and who we are with. May this crowd, our Family of Believers, make an impact in our lives and in this community as we share Your praises. We pray this in Your name,

P: We raise our Hosannas to you until the day when, "a great multitude from every nation, all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the lamb, clothed in white with palm branches in their hands cries out with a loud voice,



Health Notes

HEALTHY GUT, HEALTHY BODY

What's your gut have to do with a healthy body? Maybe you have never thought about it, but our intestines hold many wonders—God's beautiful planning. Here is a quick quiz to help you think about your intestinal health:

1. How many different species of bacteria, on average, live in your intestines or gut?

20 to 50 75 to 90 300 to 400 500 to 1,000

The correct answer is 500 to 1000. *Bacteria aren't always bad. Your gut or intestines house bacteria that help with immunity and other aspects of your health. The key is keeping the good and bad bacteria in balance. It's important to feed the good bacteria (prebiotics) and offer more of them to your system (probiotics).*

2. Prebiotics or probiotics. Which are live bacteria or yeasts found in fermented foods.

Probiotics is the correct answer. *Examples of food are: Yogurt, Sauerkraut*

3. Probiotics are known to have an _____ effect.

Inflammatory anti-inflammatory immune suppressing

The correct answer is anti-inflammatory. *Probiotics help to promote immunity.*

4. Prebiotics or probiotics. Which are specialized plant fibers that act like fertilizer to healthy gut bacteria?

The correct answer is Prebiotics. *Examples of food are: Asparagus, Artichokes, Bananas, and Garlic.*

5. Overuse of _____ can kill off and create an imbalance in healthy gut bacteria.

Laxatives Vitamin B 12 Electrolyte solutions (Propel, Pedialyte, etc) Antibiotics

Correct Answer. Antibiotics work to wipe out bacteria, sometime even the good kind!! Be sure to opt for antibiotics only when most medically appropriate.
